Art/DT	<p><u>Colourful String Art</u> Make a pulled string art painting with paint, paper, liquid watercolours, and string. The process is captivating, and the results are beautiful! Step 1: Coat string in paint. First, cut a piece of string and add it to the bowl of paint. ... Step 2: Arrange paint-covered string on paper. ... Step 3: Cover with second piece of paper. ... Step 4: Pull string out. ... Step 5: Reveal string art.</p> 	<p><u>Magazine Colour Wheel</u> Explore colour whilst recycling and explore making your own artistic colour wheel! <h3>Music</h3>	<p>Can you 'sign a rainbow'? There's a link to a poster with all the BSL signs on for every colour and a little YouTube clip to see them in action. Perhaps you could perform it for your family at home or video call them for a little concert. Once you have matched different colours and emotions, can you find a piece of music to listen to and think about what colours and images you associate with the mood that it evokes? You could create a picture using those colours. It can be any modern/classical music of your choice. E.g. for me 'The infernal gallop' (otherwise known as the cancan music) makes me think of splashes and bursts of bright, bold colours as it is an energetic piece of music which makes me feel excited. Whereas, Lily Allen's 'somewhere only we know' is more melancholy and conjures up images in muted pastel colours (of rabbits and woodland scenes thanks to the Christmas advert it featured in!) Have fun listening to some music, discussing the</p>

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		colours, images and emotions it evokes and perhaps doing some lovely artistic interpretation of a song of your choice.
<p style="text-align: center;">PSE/RE</p>	<p>Colours are often associated with moods, feelings and emotions – have you heard people say, “I feel so blue!” or “I’m seeing red!”.</p> <p>Watch this version of “The Colour Monster” by Anna Llenas. https://www.youtube.com/watch_popup?v=Ih0iu80u04Y</p> <p>Think of other emotions and choose colours that might represent them (e.g. frustration, disgust, envy). When you have your colours matched with feelings or emotions, can you organise them into jars like the little girl did for the Colour Monster? You could do this by actually filling empty jam jars with items or pictures of each colour or you could draw jars (like in the story) and colour them in – don’t forget to label them.</p> <p>At the start of the story, the Colour Monster is feeling confused. We all feel confused at times but maybe by organising our colours, we might be able to sort out the confusion in the future.</p>	<p>Hinduism</p> <p>Colours are very important in the Hindu religion. Can you find out what different colours symbolise in Hinduism? HOLI is the Hindu festival that welcomes spring each year. You will need: paper, ice cube trays, water and food colouring (or paint) and lolly sticks. Freeze the food colouring and water, or the paint in the trays and put in half a lolly stick in each cube. When frozen, take out and create a colourful masterpiece! • Challenge Activity 2) Make rainbow toast! You will need: bread, milk, food colouring and a toaster. Mix the milk and food colouring to make edible paint, paint your bread and pop it in the toaster. Yum! 	

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
